That tells us that since 2000 unfortunately Skal USA has lost its ground in the industry. As of 2000 the technology took a fast pace and with that everything started to change, and it seems like Skal USA was not able to catch the phase and./or adopt to the changes. So we are behind but important thing is we are catching up! However, we need to know we have no room slow down again if we want to take our place among the big players in the industry.

### **NOTES OF INTEREST:**

### **Balance Sheet:**

- The \$140,240 in our operating (checking) account is primarily the 2018 Skål International and Skål USA dues received to date from all clubs.
  - Skål International dues, in Euro equivalent, were forwarded to SI on 1 March, which will be reflected in the end of March Financial Report.
- The majority of the \$91,261.37 Accounts Receivable is the 2018 dues that have not yet been received from some clubs.
- As noted in previous monthly reports, the \$11,000 SI Dues Current Assets (#1450.1) is the deposit paid to lock in the dollar to euro rate for our 2018 membership dues payment to Skål International.
- As reported earlier, the \$30,000 "Note Receivable-SI Miami" is the loan from Skål USA to SI Miami for the advance deposit to the cruise line for the 2019 Skål International World Congress
  - o Interest to Skål USA will paid on this loan

Skalleagues:

March has been a busy month!

Skal media: Prepared two articles for Skal Magazine and assisted with a third one. In discussions with SI International President Lavonne Wittmann made future plans for articles on Destination Capitol Hill and the North American Skal Congress. The Skal Magazine articles have appeared, however, they are inaccessible at the time of this report due to my travel to China and the cyber wall that exists here.

Additionally, a piece for Journeys, the publication of Skal USA, was part of the new issue.

Skal visibility. Coordinated the visit of President Burcin Turkkan for the first official delegation of Skal USA at Destination Capitol Hill, the travel industry's lobbying days in Washington. During the visit, we were able to meet key leaders from US Travel, Brand USA, International Inbound Travel Association, National Tour Association, Destinations International, and the International Association of Exhibitions and Events. Both Burcin and I maintained a full schedule of Capitol Hill appointments meeting personally with Senators, Representatives, or their staffs. Unfortunately, an unanticipated snow storm postponed the Skal Washington meeting at which President Burcin was scheduled to speak. While it was held the next day, Burcin was unable to change her flight, so the regular DC standby Executive Committee member (yours truly) filled in.

Advocacy Committee. A meeting of this group is tentatively scheduled for April 6 to review current issues and prepare a questionnaire for clubs on other issues to consider.

Membership development. Successfully proposed a new program to build new clubs by identifying committed club builders who will provide a prospect list of thirty or more and complete the new club within a year. Such approved individuals will receive an Active Individual Member status, courtesy of Skal USA. The first two such AIM selectees are Jackie Cross of the SI Valley of the Sun prospective club in Arizona and Kate Heath of the SI Central California prospective club.
